Our third installment in highlighting success stories in this, PCRF's 20th anniversary year, is that of 19-year-old Kyle Campbell. Our stories in our newsletter this year are meant to inspire us all as we continue to win the battle against pediatric cancer. Please remember, however, that today pediatric cancer continues to be the leading disease cause of death in children under 18. Our fight is not over, but because of stories like Kyle's, it only reinforces why we must continue to do our battle.

Looking at Kyle today, one could not imagine that at 4 years of age he began fighting for his life when he was diagnosed with acute lymphocytic leukemia. Kyle endured three years of chemotherapy for his disease. Today he enjoys motorcycle riding and camping, as well as boating and wave runners. A far cry from that sick child diagnosed 15 years ago. He has also been an artist for the PCRF holiday card program in the past. Kyle noted that "having been so young at the time, I feel I missed out on a normal childhood. I still have a hard time making friends."

Kyle has a friend in PCRF and we will continue to pursue every road to find a cure for pediatric cancer so that all children can have a normal childhood.

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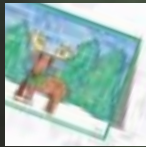

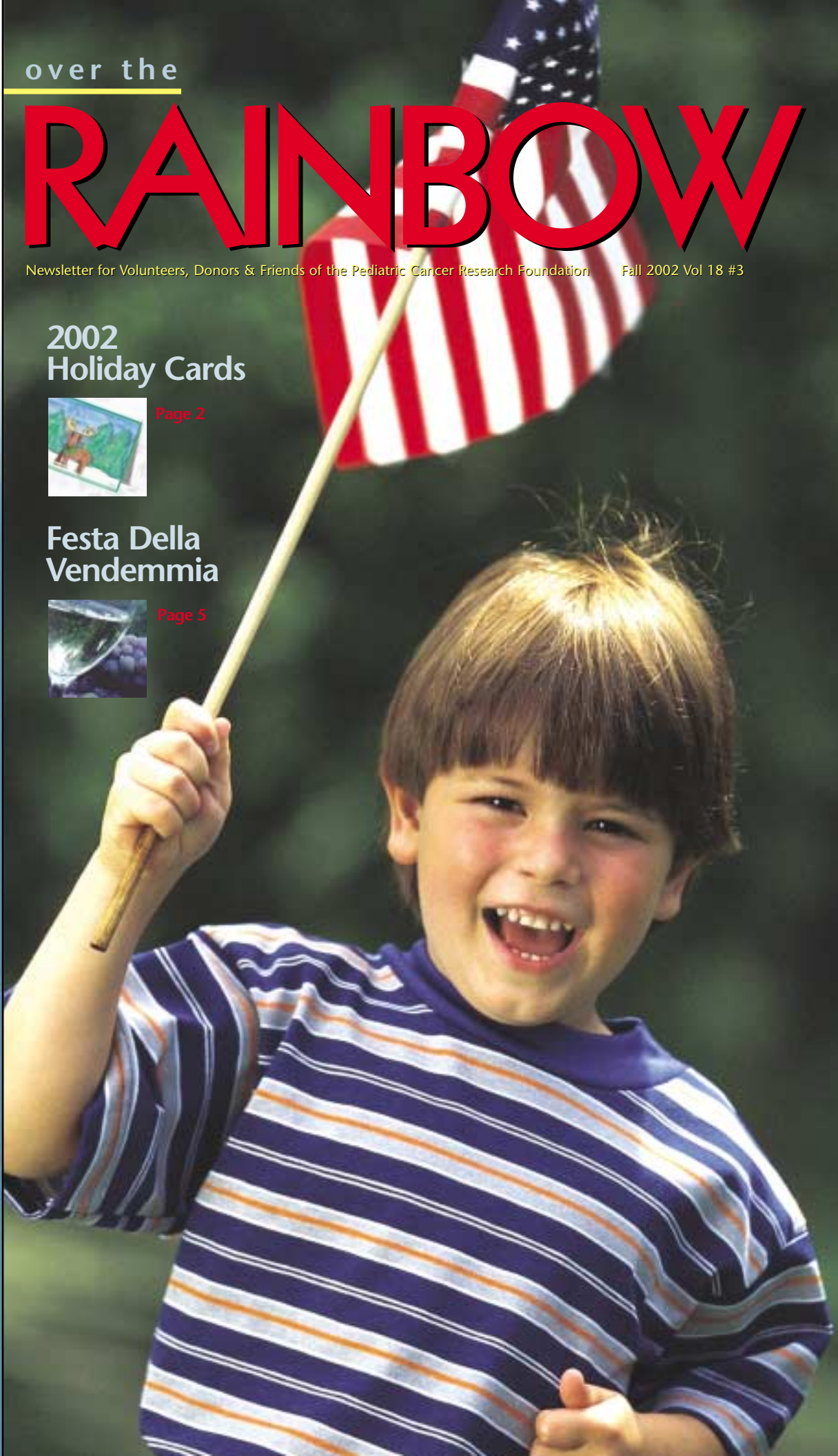


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President's Message

RESEARCH LAB UPDATE- PCRFC Consortium

The PCRFC Consortium (PCRFC) has been actively pursuing the goal of making an impact on the survival rate of children diagnosed with cancer or lethal blood or immune disorders who have a poor prognosis because of relapse or refractory disease. The main objective of the PCRFC is to support the development and completion of early new experimental Phase I and Phase II trials in children who require alternative therapy. The consortium consists of five institutions: Children's Hospital of New York, Children's Hospital of Los Angeles, Mattel Children's Hospital at UCLA, Children's National Medical Center at George Washington University and Children's Hospital of Orange County. There are approximately 58 approved PCRFC consortium clinical research protocols that are under active investigation.

Approximately 44 of these 58 approved protocols are Phase I/II clinical research protocols investigating new agents or new drug combinations for acute lymphoblastic leukemia, neuroblastoma, lymphoma, soft tissue sarcomas, hepatoblastoma, germ cell tumors, brain tumors, and solid tumors. Fourteen of the approved PCRFC protocols are primarily involved in biological investigations for all pediatric cancers. In the past 12 months, we have enrolled 216 patients onto PCRFC consortium studies. Since the inception of the PCRFC Consortium on July 1, 1998, 540 children have been enrolled in clinical research studies supported by PCRFC.

The grant funds provided by PCRFC to the Consortium institutions have supported the increased accrual of children onto these clinical studies, thus reducing the time required to answer critical clinical research questions. Completion of these early phase studies will provide us with new treatment options in the next generation of children with cancer and lethal blood and immune diseases. These efforts significantly contribute to the strategies of not only extending the survival of our current patients but also developing promising therapies for future generations of children.

On behalf of my co-investigators including Drs. Siegel and Gaynon for Children's Hospital of Los Angeles, Drs. Moore and Feig from UCLA, Dr. Shen from Children's Hospital of Orange County and Drs. Angiolillo and Reaman from Children's National Medical Center, as well as Virginia Davenport, R.N., the coordinator for the entire Consortium, we would like to thank PCRFC and its volunteers for their tremendous and enthusiastic support for this clinical consortium.

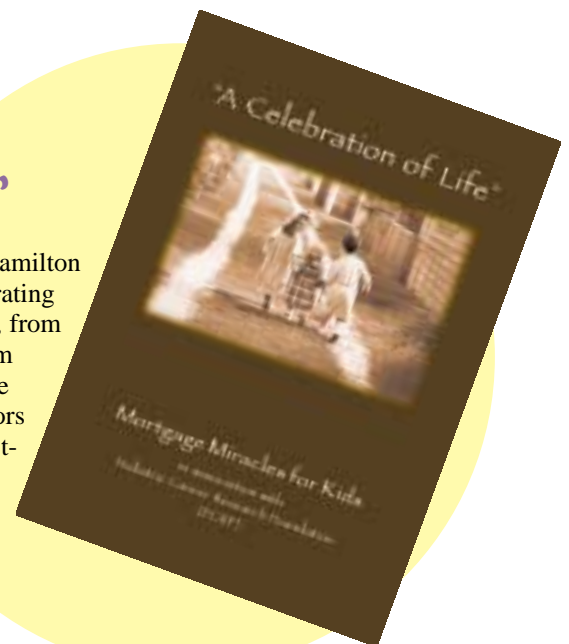

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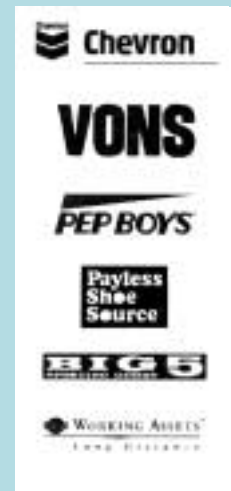
